Post Operative Instructions Myringotomy and Tubes

A “Myringotomy” or “Tympanostomy” is a surgical incision in the eardrum usually to release fluid or pressure that is trapped behind it. A “tube” is a small plastic or metal tube (about one millimeter in diameter, or about one-tenth the size of a dime) that keeps a small hole in the eardrum. The tube will eventually become dislodged and the myringotomy incision will almost always heal. Some things to remember while the tubes are in place:

- You may see a small amount of bleeding or yellow fluid from the ears for the first day or two. If this persists, or appears to be excessive, please call our office.
- Mild pain in the ear and throat is possible for the first day.
- You do not need ear plugs for routine bathing or swimming. Try to avoid soapy water in the ear and you may want to use earplugs if the head is submerged in soapy water.
- Drainage from the ear may be the sign of an ear infection. It is not an emergency so you do not have to become immediately concerned. Try to clean gently around the outside of the ear with a clean cloth and call the office during regular hours. You will likely be prescribed antibiotic ear drops x 5-7 days. If the drainage persists, you should come in to the office to be evaluated.
- No special diet or other change in activity is required.
